1. Discuss 4th of July Event

Commissioner Harry Brodhead explained the reason for this meeting. Commissioner Harry Brodhead stated he heard there was an issue with Amvets 447 donating the money that was collected at the beer tent during the 4th of July celebration. Commissioner Harry Brodhead also stated that he heard a rumor that one of the Inglis Commissioners did not want to accept the money.

Commissioner Veronica Reardon stated there were a few residents that complained about the DJ being told not to play any country music. Commissioner Harry Brodhead stated he spoke to Eric the DJ, and that Eric confirmed that Commissioner Daryl Lynaugh did tell him not to play any county music. Commissioner Harry Brodhead stated during the event Mayor Isaac Young had asked Eric the DJ how everything was going, Eric had replied with "Pretty good, beside that I can't play any country music. Commissioner Harry Brodhead stated that at that time Eric had told Mayor Isaac Young what his impression of what Commissioner Daryl Lynaugh had told him. Commissioner Daryl Lynaugh spoke for himself and stated that that comment was a lie and that he never told Eric that country music wasn't allowed to be played.

Commissioner Harry Brodhead stated that a few commissioners had gone to a mandated Ethics training class in Cedar Key. Commissioner Harry Brodhead stated that part of the Ethics class the public has a right to know how and why the commission makes decisions the way they do. Commissioner Harry Brodhead stated he wanted a special meeting to discuss what had happened at the event without breaking the Sunshine laws. Commissioner Daryl Lynaugh stated he tried to have a few workshops, but the commission turned it down. Commissioner Veronica Reardon told Commissioner Daryl Lynaugh that it was never turned down, he just never put in an Agenda request. Commissioner Harry Brodhead also told Commissioner Daryl Lynaugh an Agenda requested is needed be a Workshop can be planned.

Commissioner Veronica Reardon stated that a few residents had asked her why Amvets 447 did not donate anything towards the 4th of July celebration. Commissioner Veronica Reardon stated that the David Jacobs- Pratt the Commander at Amvets 447, tried to give Commissioner Daryl Lynaugh the money that was made from the beer tent that night, but Commissioner Daryl Lynaugh stated he didn't want the money.

Commissioner Veronica Reardon then stated that David Jacobs- Pratt met with Mayor Isaac Young to donate the full amount that was made from the beer tent. Commissioner Harry Brodhead stated he called the Commander, David Jacobs-Pratt to get the full story behind the donation being turned down. Commissioner Harry Brodhead stated that David Jacobs-Pratt said the Town turned down the donation because it was beer money. Commissioner Daryl Lynaugh stated that it was a lie. Commissioner Daryl Lynaugh stated that he did not want to accept the money that night.

Ron, an Inglis resident stated that nobody should take money without a receipt. Ron also stated that receipt protect both parties from being accused of stealing. Ron stated that Commissioner Daryl Lynaugh did the right thing by not taking the cash that night.

John Reardon, Inglis resident read a text message from David Jacobs-Pratt.

Michael White, Inglis resident agrees that Commissioner Daryl Lynaugh did nothing wrong. Michael white also stated that all Agenda requests are supposed to have information attached with it, and that this current meeting did not have any attachments.

Commissioner Veronica Reardon stated that the Commission wanted to discuss what happened during the 4th of July event, and the only way to discuss anything is to have a meeting. Commissioner Veronica Reardon also stated the town doesn't need to burn any bridges with Amvets 447 or the DJ Eric because they both do a lot for the town.

Commissioner Veronica Reardon thanked Chris McGann for all the help he did at the 4th of July celebration. Commissioner Daryl Lynaugh listed the few people that helped with the celebration.

Chris McGann, Inglis resident stated that arrangements were already made for the handing of the money that night.

Meghann, IRC member stated that during one of the IRC meetings, Commissioner Daryl Lynaugh had suggested having a rock and roll band for the 4th of July celebration and Meghann agreed to look for a rock and roll band but with it being a short notice, no rock and roll band was available. Commissioner Daryl Lynaugh stated next year the Band will be booked earlier. Meghann also gave some suggestions for next year in regards to handing of the money.

Anthony Fattorusso, Owner of Wise Guys brought up an issue that has been circling around town.

Chris McGann, Inglis resident stated that the 4th of July celebration was amazing. Chris MaGann also stated that 29 Businesses in town donated towards the 4th of July celebration.

Commissioner Harry Brodhead stated that planning needs to be better for town event, and Inglis residents should start volunteering.

Commissioner Daryl Lynaugh questioned the upcoming events.

Commissioner Harry Brodhead asked Commissioner Daryl Lynaugh when the next upcoming IRC is. Commissioner Daryl Lynaugh stated they just had it July 14, 2025. Meghann from IRC stated that it is the third Monday of every month.

Michael White stated he was unhappy with how tall the grass was and believed the ballpark could have been cleaned up better. Chris McGann stated the town did what they could with all the rain and the park looked great.



Tamara Slagle, Inglis resident stated the event was great, the only issue was the Sheriff's left while the fireworks were going off.


Adjourn.
